

# ALPHABET BINGO!

Ages 4+ 2-6 Players

## INCLUDES

- 6 double-sided playing boards
- 26 letter tokens
- 72 plastic chips
- Drawstring bag

## OBJECT

To be the first player to cover four letters in one row or column.

## SET UP

- Punch out the letter tokens and put them in the token bag.
- Give one board and a handful of chips to each player.
- Decide who will be the “caller” for the game. The caller is the person who pulls the tokens from the bag and calls out the letters. The caller can play the game, but doesn’t have to play. Players can take turns being the caller.

## HOW TO PLAY

Without looking, the caller reaches into the bag and pulls out one token. The caller announces the letter on the token and shows the other players the letter side of the token. All players who have that letter on their board, cover that letter with a chip.

## HOW TO WIN

The first player to fill one row or column with chips shouts “Bingo!” and is the winner.



## OTHER WAYS TO PLAY!

- **Cooperative Bingo**  
All players play one board together. A great game for younger players!
- **Everyone Wins Bingo**  
All players continue playing until each completes one row or column on their board.
- **Picture Bingo**  
Instead of calling the letter, the caller announces the item on the picture-side of the token and shows only the picture-side of the token.
- **No Peek Bingo**  
The caller calls the letter without showing the other players either side of the token. Can you find the letters without seeing them?
- **Letter Sound Bingo**  
Without showing the letter, the caller makes

the sound of the letter. For example, “sss” for S and “mmm” for M and so on.



- **Full Card Bingo**  
The first player to place a chip on EVERY space on their board wins.
- **Frame Bingo**  
The first player to place a chip on each outside space on the board wins.

## LEARN THROUGH PLAY

Alphabet Bingo is a playful teaching tool to help children learn letters. Identifying UPPERCASE letters is the first step to reading and writing. When a child can recognize and name letters, she has an easier time making connections between those letters and the sounds they stand for. Encourage your child’s literacy growth by playing Alphabet Bingo and its many varia-
